Feasibility Study

Our Renovation Task Force (RTF) has identified several important projects for our church, but before we move forward anymore, we want to hear from our entire faith community!

Our proposed renovation focuses on changes to the Red Brick Preschool and Children's Education Wing and campus-wide improvements to improve efficiency, accessibility, and sustainability. Your input will help identify possible volunteer leaders and set a financial goal should the church choose to move forward with a campaign. This process is critical to gauge support for a potential major fundraising effort to pay for all, or some, of our projects.



Beginning February 10, everyone will receive a letter in the mail, along with a fact sheet about the projects and details on how you can provide feedback. Your input and participation will help us make wise decisions about the projects and a potential capital campaign. The more feedback we receive, the better decision we can make as a community moving into the future.

The Session reviewed and approved the 2020 operating budget, and heard from Stewardship Representative Frank Polese and Dr. Bayne who said "In my memory this is the best year financially as we bring a surplus from 2019 and make no transfers from reserves."

Capital Campaign Committee Chairperson Pam Werner reported that the Steier Group has been engaged to conduct a feasibility study over the next two months.

Starting in January the Session is improving security and the archiving of its documents as the elders learn to use a secure Google Docs folder.

Interfaith Shelter -Volunteers Needed!

In San Diego County, nearly 9,000 of our neighbors are homeless (according to the Regional Task Force for the Homeless' 2018 Homelessness Summary Fact Sheet). Beginning February 23, we are again hosting up to 12 homeless guests (men, women and children) who are actively working with case managers at New Life Urban Ministries (formerly called PUM) to seek employment, long-term housing and other services. Through the Interfaith



Shelter, a non-denominational rotational shelter, the participants receive shelter, food and support services at different churches in the community. We need a whole host of volunteers to assure that our homeless brothers and sisters feel safe and well-cared for during their stay with us. Together for the Family Update



Two million Syrians have fled to Lebanon to escape their civil war. On December 22, we had the privilege of hosting PLCPC mission partner Izdihar Kassis and her family. She shared the wonderful work that her organization, *Together for the Family*, is doing to aid the million refugees living in UN camps near her native Zahle, across the Lebanese border from Syria. *Together For the Family* finds gaps in care and fills them, including trauma healing for mothers and children, music programs, sewing

and hair salon career building programs for young women, special education for handicapped children and more. Seeing how she and her staff pour themselves out, many Muslim refugees come to Christ. PLCPC has partnered with TFF since 2011. In the photos Izdihar brought two gifts: a beautiful altar cloth sewn by her sewing class and a painting

by Izdihar herself showing our generosity as water pouring out of a frame, transcending boundaries. She was accompanied by her husband Riad Kassis, a Lebanese theologian who directs the John Stott/Langham Partnership for global theological education. Thank you for joining us to hear about their work!

2019 Annual Reports

Senior Pastor

Rev. Karla Shaw

For the majority of 2019 (from the pulpit) we studied the book of Acts. This wild ride of a story of the early church in many ways has mirrored the ways our community has grown and cared for each other this past year. Because we are a family, it certainly continues to be difficult when our members are called by God to go home, but God in his faithfulness keeps bringing new life in our midst as well. This fall we embraced our theme of "Your Story, Our Story, God's Story" here are some of the highlights/changes we have experienced this year:

- Alicia McMillan moved from being our Interim
 Director of Worship and Music into a permanent role.
- We launched Kid's Café, a new worshipping community, on Sunday mornings.
- Pastor Alex and his wife, Megan, ran a consistent and meaningful grief group throughout most of the winter, spring and summer months.
- We began a partnership with Christian Youth Theatre (CYT) who are now meeting on our campus on Friday nights and Saturdays and have begun to populate our youth ministry.
- Jolene Wade was hired as our *Director of Operations* and *Church Life* and has moved us through volunteer processes, new office efficiencies, and security initiatives.
- Our chapel got a new, beautiful cross!
- Our Session and staff began the process of strategic planning looking forward to our centennial.
- We ministered to 220 kids and almost 100 volunteers through our VBS summer program and ministered to 150 families through our now year-round preschool.
- Our special worship services were outstanding this year, as we attempted to experience God in new ways through a Tenebrae service, contemplative retreats, art experiences, and a modern take on the Nativity.
- We sent two groups on mission trips down to Rancho Genesis to help build their new camp.
- We cared for the homeless through our Interfaith Shelter, hosted Chopped at Church, and gave our time, talent, and money to dozens of mission partners in this region and around the globe.
- All this, AND, we gave sacrificially to make this year the best financial year the church has ever seen in recent memory so we can continue in our "Loving Everyone to LIFE with Everything we Have."

God has written a great story through our church this year! And this doesn't even include the many ministries that meet daily on our campus or the work God is doing as we dream about the future renovation. God is alive here and God is working. Thanks be to God! I am grateful to be a part of this family.

Associate Pastor Rev. Alex Wirth

There are a lot of things that happen every year at this church and I have now done them all twice. There are others on staff that are newer than me now and they ask me questions about how things usually work. I love getting to pray with you in that way and see all the faithful ways you engage with prayer.

Director of Operations & Church Life Jolene Wade

2019 was a year of transition as we said goodbye, with much appreciation, to the very helpful and talented Melissa Mullins, in the late spring. Much of the rest of the

year was following through on projects that were in progress, including;

- Rolling out the Volunteer Handbook and background checking procedures for those in leadership roles, or proximity to children or money. We now have a register for all volunteers who've been background checked.
- Completion of the Family Life Center (FLC) re-roofing.
- Termite tenting in mid August, which led to replacing the 100 gal water heater in the Youth Center (YC)
- Completion of the stained-glass cross in the Chapel, installed in time for Fall Kick-Off Sunday. We are now carefully considering disposition of the Chapel dossal cloth.
- The Renovation Task Force (RTF) worked endlessly to arrive at a plan for updating the campus to serve our diverse and dynamic needs, and presented an effective concept in late July. We continue to refine this for cost efficiencies.
- Further implementation of our Facility Use Policy and rates. Our campus has hosted numerous events for appropriate outside organizations, in the FLC, YC and Chapel, including a PLHS Christmas Concert. As of September we opened some available campus space to host CYT (Christian Youth Theatre) rehearsals on a weekly basis.

Other projects that presented themselves in 2019 include:

- An unexpected gift of beautiful and uniform updated office furniture that we moved from Irvine.
- The addition of air conditioning in a Preschool room for summer nappers.
- Addition of permanent rigging to display large banners from Sanctuary columns and the front of the Chapel (saving the cost of expensive lift equipment) Thank you John Spafford for the brilliant design and installation!
- Upgrades to internet connectivity hardware, adding enterprise level anti-virus software, and unifying Microsoft Office accounts.
- The purchase of our first PLCPC branded pop-up tent to support outreach at church and community events.
 Thank you Deacons for the funding!
- Ensuring fire protection, first aid kits and AEDs are up to date
- A new overhead sound system in FLC is being quoted

In other Church Life, the steps to implement our Security Plan are coming into focus, driven by a variety of needs. We've added new key and office access protocols. You can expect to see more cameras and locks installed in the months to come, as well as opportunities for pro-active campus greeters. Our goal is to maintain a welcoming environment where all who enter feel safe.

It's been fun learning more about our wonderful community members and all the energy that goes into

making PLCPC such a great church home. There's rarely a quiet moment in maintaining our facilities and numerous resources to support our community and mission.

Director of Worship & Music Alicia McMillan

2019 has been an active and transitional year for PLCPC's music ministry. Senior Adult Ministry continues to evolve as the needs of mature adults change.

- Monthly luncheons continued to be offered and were well-attended in 2019. These luncheons are a favorite activity of our most aged seniors, and are usually themebased. Highlights included St. Patrick's Day theme, Italian Ristorante, and Honoring Our Veterans.
- Monthly lectures on various topics such as health care, transportation, personal growth and emotional wellbeing are popular with the younger seniors.
- Our weekly exercise class (in partnership with the Peninsula Family YMCA) was also very well-attended, averaging 25+ participants each Wednesday morning.
- The Current Event Discussion Group took place monthly in the first half of 2019, and while it was an enjoyable time for those who attended, it was replaced with Memory Friends in Fall 2019. Memory Friends seeks to meet the needs of people experiencing memory changes due to aging or brain illness/injury by providing social time, support and brain games.
- Outings took place approximately every other month to various places such as the Sheriff's Museum, The Lot, Mormon Battalion Museum, and the Miniature Engineering Craftsmanship Museum, using the church van.
- We enjoy a close partnership with Peninsula Shepherd Center, which provides transportation to several of our programs.

My hope is to find new ways to honor and celebrate the seniors among us and support them through the journey of aging. I feel privileged and grateful to serve in this role at PLCPC.

Men's Ministry

More than 25 men attended and participated in our Men's Retreat at Rancho Viva in May of 2019. We had a great weekend of fellowship, worship and intentional time of

connecting with God and each other. Our theme was "Storyline" and different men shared their stories of faith at each of the four large group gatherings.

Prayers and Pints events were increased to bi-monthly in 2019 that were each attended by 25-35 men. These gatherings serve our men well in a casual, community setting that offers great opportunities for conversation and connections.

Our Men@Work Ministry happens with faithful men of PLCPC on Wednesday mornings. Those men have taken on many projects, both big and small around the church on a regular basis. The group has 10-16 attendees on a weekly basis. Thank you to Don Griffith, Em Cummins and many others for your faithful leadership.

The Wednesday Men's Bible Study led by Dr. Gresham Bayne and Art Michalek has been consistent all year. This group of guys committed to sharing in their lives and faith every week. The men are challenged with deep biblical teaching every week.

New in 2019 was Monday Morning Men's coffee. This happens Monday Mornings at Peet's coffee on Catalina Blvd. There was a consistent group of 8-13 men attending on a weekly basis, with more than 35 different men attending at least once.

Outreach Events

On May 31 we blocked off Udall St. in front of the church for our 2nd Annual Neighborhood Block Party. With two food trucks, crafts and games for the kids and live music from our café band led by Marc Shaw, more than 250 people from our church and neighborhood enjoyed a fun night out in the street. Our Fall Kick-Off on Sept 8 gave our congregation an opportunity to live out this years' theme, "Your Story, Our Story, God's Story" in a variety of creative/expressive/artistic ways. Thanks to all of the ministry leaders that participated and represented over 15 of our PLCPC ministries!

Director of Youth Ministry / Café Worship Leader R.O. Smith

Café Worship

The Café had another strong year of growth! We continue to see slow and steady growth in the Café Service. I feel like we have found consistency with our volunteers, and it feels like there is a good rhythm and "vibe" within the service.

Podcast

This fall, we launched the "Point Loma Community Church Podcast," in which we publish the Sunday morning sermon. We are exploring other avenues and uses in which the podcast can serve our community and beyond.

Youth **Youth**

BRICK Youth continues to discover what it means to love others to life with everything we have. Here are some of the

highlights from 2019, and projected highlights we look forward to:

Camp Experiences

Last year was an interesting time of re-evaluation for a couple of our camp experiences. We did not go to Forest Home Winter Camp in 2019 in order to reassess if it is meeting the needs of students.

Our Junior High summer camp experience at Campus by the Sea was also re-evaluated because in 2019 we did not go due to lack of interest.

High School Houseboats was a highlight as it always is. This year we took 13 students and 2 leaders to Lake Shasta. It was an amazing adventure, and it really brought people in our group closer together.

This spring and fall, we took overnight retreats to Rancho Viva. The retreat was designed to give students the opportunity to simply "get away" and get out of their normal weekend environments, and out into nature. Students had the opportunity to hike, swim, play pickleball, relax on hammocks, and play games together. We also took time to experience spiritual practices, such as lectio divina, and praying the scriptures. Both retreats had about 5-6 students and 2-3 leaders.

Confirmation

We determined that Confirmation will be offered every other year and will be open to 7-10 grade students. Confirmation will be April 19 through June 14, 2020.

Service Opportunities and Missions

We maintain a bi-monthly involvement with Ladle Fellowship by serving the first Sunday of every odd numbered month (i.e. January, March, May, etc.) The service opportunity is open to everyone in the church. One of the nice surprises in serving at Ladle has been the heavy involvement by the Scout Troop we charter.

Last year, we added a Youth Build Mission Trip for 6th -12 grade students during Spring Break to help build the new Rancho Genesis property in Mexico. We took 13 students and 3 leaders, and worked on a variety of projects throughout the camp. Many kids got to use power tools for the first time, and we all came home exhausted. We learned what it means to build upon the foundation of our faith, which is Christ. We are returning to Rancho Genesis this year during Spring Break!

Weekly Meetings

The move we made to Monday night last year has proven to be beneficial, and with hosting CYT, we are starting to see some of those students attending our Monday night Youth Group. For Junior High, we average weekly attendance was 15 (with 54 distinct students). High School saw an average attendance of 16 (with 51 distinct students).

Weekly Small Groups

On Sunday mornings during the Café Service time, we averaged 9 (41 distinct) junior high students who meet for small group. We have two faithful volunteers for that time, and look to add more volunteers to be part of the Sunday morning small group community.

High School Small Group continues to meet on Thursday nights. This fall, we moved our meeting to various students' houses. We continued to see a slight increase in average attendance (7) this past year with 22 distinct students who attended throughout the year.

YMCA and CYT

Two new exciting opportunities we had this year were to be the host facility for the YMCA and CYT (Christian Youth Theater).

The YMCA holds an after-school program for students 13 years of age and older. They consistently have about 20-30 students come and go from the Youth Center on Tuesday afternoons. This is an opportunity to get "face time" and build relationships with students in the community.

As of this fall, the Youth Center also hosts Christian Youth Theater for 8 weeks on Fridays and Saturdays as they work on their upcoming production. On Saturday, we typically have 55-75 kids working on their craft. One Saturday during their production season we provide them pizza for lunch, and our Women's Bible Study makes homemade cookies for the students another Saturday. The kids are very appreciative, and we have seen some of those students start attending our weekly youth programs.

Director of Children's Ministry Karen Connor

2019 was a full year in Children's Ministry. In January we launched **Kids Café**, a Sunday worship service just for kids at the 9:45 hour. Children, ages 3 years-5th grade, meet as a group in the FLC for songs, activities and a message before breaking out into age-graded small groups. Scripture, prayer and an offering are included in this dynamic experience where children hear God's story in fresh, fun, and meaningful ways. Our 8:30 am service continues to offer a traditional Sunday School program. Children join their parents in the sanctuary for the first part of the service, hear a children's message and then proceed to age-graded classrooms for a Bible based lesson.

We embraced some personnel changes last year when church member Erin Shetter joined our team as the new **Children's Ministry Assistant**. Our beloved Cynthia Hernandez has transitioned from assistant to the **Children's Ministry Preschool and Nursery Coordinator**. She plans and teaches preschool curriculum for Sundays and Kids Club as well as manages our nursery program for ages 6 months-3 years.

Journey, our mid-week program for 4th and 5th graders, continues to serve children within and outside our church community. Energetic kids gather on Monday afternoons for active games, a Bible message, and food. Our program coordinates with Brick Jr. High by sharing our meal together and planning offsite activities such as laser tag, bowling and roller skating.

Kids Club, our mid-week program for children ages 4 yrs-6th grade is held on Thursdays and is typically paired with the Children's Choir led by Alicia McMillan. We value the relationships built with the kids through crafts, play and Bible stories.

In January, 16 of our children attended **Forest Home Children's Winter Camp** in the San Bernadino Mountains where they spent a fun-filled weekend with other Christian youth and were given the opportunity to commit their hearts to Christ.

In April, eight children, grades 3 & above, graduated from our **Bible Memory** course. These students participated in a special Sunday School class, led by Judy Pritchett, to learn all about the Bible. They memorized scripture and learned how the Bible pertains to their daily lives. Upon completing the course work and reciting their Life Verse in front of the congregation they were awarded a personalized Bible during a cake and lemonade reception.

Our two-part **Communion Experience** class was held during Lent which gave 4th & 5th graders an interactive opportunity to learn more about the ten plagues, the Exodus, a Seder dinner, and to receive communion.

Our MOPS (Mothers of Preschoolers) program, run by Sarah Butterfield, hosts bi-monthly meetings on Mondays from September through May. In the MOPS program moms with young children form relationships with other moms to share, learn, and grow in Christ together. Other MOPS opportunities include park dates, mom's night out, and a Book Club. A new MOPS Bible study was launched on Mondays.

In June, our annual **Vacation Bible School** hosted 225 children on our campus for an engaging and lively week of learning all about God through music, Bible stories, games and more. Our theme was "Roar" and our sanctuary was transformed into an amazing African game preserve including a giant canopy of leaves. Our VBS mission project raised funds for Living Water to help build a clean water well for an under privileged community. Together, the children raised an unbelievable \$2,000!

On Palm Sunday, we hosted our seventh annual **Easter Fest** as an outreach for our church and Point Loma community. Our expanded celebration encouraged attendance from all generations. Activities included live music, food, a chalk prayer wall, donkey photo op, cookie decorating, Bingo, a

bounce house, and inflatable obstacle course.

In December, our staff came together to host our sixth annual **Red Brick Christmas** party in the Family Life Center. All ages gathered for the festivities which included crafts, a pajama parade, a Christmas carol sing-a-long, and a special visit from Santa.

Preschool & TLC Director Nicole Hage

The preschool continues to grow and thrive. This school year we were able to expand our extended day program to better accommodate working families. The hours are from 7:30 am -5:00 pm. We have a total of 8 preschool classrooms. This gives us the opportunity to serve around 150+ families.

Every year we offer free early intervention and vision screenings. These are put on by Autism Tree Project foundation and The Elks Programs.

Our annual Poinsettia fund raiser was successful this year; helping us raise \$1,000 that we used to purchase supplies for the classrooms.

We continue to invite preschool families to join church events and this is helping us grow our church. Easter Fest, Red Brick Christmas and Neighborhood Block Party were all wonderful and brought many preschool families to our church. The preschool VBS and summer camp grew, and the families seem to enjoy having these safe and fun events for their children.

At Christmas time the families gave Gifts to the Manger, which donated a truck full of diapers and other baby supplies to Military Outreach Ministries.

As we gear up for the next fall registration, we are excited to have new families enter our program. Thank you for your continued support of the preschool.

Personnel Committee Dwight Kellogg

The year 2019 was again an active year for the personnel committee. The committee included elders Dwight Kellogg, Debbie Fountain and Buck Buchanan and member Claudia Bender.

The committee continued its initiatives to assure consistency in the application of church employment practices and PLCPC's adherence to governmental and Presbyterian church requirements, as well as its own policies. The committee reviewed benefits changes made available to the staff during the year.

The church Volunteer Handbook, drafts of which were subjected to extensive review by the committee and key church staff members, was adopted by the Session at its March 27, 2019 meeting. Jolene Wade, Director of Operations and Church Life, led the introduction of the handbook to affected church entities.

The committee discussed the Presbytery's Sexual Misconduct Prevention Policy and Child, Youth, and Vulnerable Adult Protection Policy to assure that the existing church employment and volunteer practices are in compliance.

The committee responded promptly to numerous administrative matters brought to them by the pastors and staff.

The committee gave recommendations in support of a compensation increase in the year 2020 for Pastor Karla, based on a comparison study of other churches of comparable size within the Presbytery.

Board of Deacons

Jan Sutton

The Deacons provide a ministry of care and compassion. We have representatives on many church committees, support Loaves and Fishes, and New Day Urban Ministries (formerly Presbyterian Urban Ministries) and the OB Community Dinners. We run the Lenten Food Drive, which was another big success in 2019. We provide baby roses, send greeting cards to members, and send college care packages. The Deacons collect backpacks and money for bus passes for New Day Urban Ministries (formerly PUM). We provide dinners to members in need.

Each Sunday we greet and welcome people to church, and after the services, we deliver flowers to members of our community. On Easter, all Deacons delivered flowers to more than 60 people.

We supported many church events such as Ash Wednesday, Maundy Thursday, Easter Fest, and Red Brick Christmas. The Prayer Chain is run by a member of the College of Deacons, and we participate in the Discover our Community Classes.

In February, The Deacons hosted a training series for visiting people, and praying with and for people. The training was open to all.

Three Pancake Breakfasts raised money for the Youth Build Mission Trip and scholarships for youth camps, a branded shade canopy, and a changeable obstacle course for the Toddler Learning Center.

Endowment Committee

Steve Smith

The year was an active time for the Endowment. The Endowment was pleased to make a number of grants to support the work of the church in several different areas.

Grants

- A major grant of \$25,000 was approved, at the request of the Session, to cover part of the cost of the major roof repair earlier in the year.
- A grant was made to support Urban Youth Collaborative, which includes student-led faith clubs at close to 100 public middle and high school campuses in San Diego County.
- Two grants were made to support the music program through professional development and funds for the Christmas concert.
- The Endowment voted to set aside up to \$25,000 of past earnings to support a "Capital Campaign direct to the Future of PLCPC."

Generous Donors

Generous donors (through gifts and bequests) provided \$32,379.49 in contributions to the Endowment during the year. In addition, the Endowment received notice of several other bequests that members were designating as part of their estate plans.

Other Activities of the Endowment

During the course of the year, the Endowment also distributed a brochure on the opportunities for service and giving that the Endowment represents, entitled, "Plant a Seed—Create a Legacy." The Endowment also presented a program, "Maximizing Your Church and Minimizing Your Taxes" starring Woody Ledford. Woody explained ways of contributing to the church that also carried tax advantages. The Endowment also published information about its activities in the *Spire* on a regular basis.

The Endowment worked through 2019 with the Audit Committee to ensure that changes are made in the official audit report to correctly categorize the principal of the Endowment as permanently restricted by donors. That effort continues.

Finances

The Endowment funds are invested with a part of the Presbyterian Foundation, as required by the Bylaws. Those Bylaws also provide that income (interest and dividends) are available for grants, but the appreciation in the principal is returned to the principal, and the Committee, of course, follows these instructions.

The Foundation has not yet distributed year-end results, so we can report formal results only through the third quarter. As a result, we will publish the final results in the *Spire* in a month or so. The principal of the Endowment as of 9/30/19 was \$1.94 million.

Members of the Endowment Committee

The members of the Endowment Committee were Dianne Grafton (vice-chair), Mary Harker (Session representative), John Leimbach, Ray Lidstrom (treasurer), John Pearson, Steve Smith (chair), Cara Thome, and Pastor Karla and Jolene Wade served as *ex officio* members. Mary Harker and Ray Lidstrom are cycling off the committee. We are very grateful for their extraordinary service. Mary has been the secretary this year and Ray has served as treasurer of the Endowment for many years. Thank you for your strong support during 2019.

Nominating Committee Mary Harker

The Nominating Committee presented a slate of 7 new Elders, 10 new Deacons, and 3 returning Deacons for election in September. The Committee also recommended that our 4 current representatives to the Presbytery will serve in 2020 as well.

The Nominating Committee Handbook has been updated and used for training and reference for the Elders who are Chair and Vice Chair of the 2020 Nominating Committee.

Mission Beyond Committee Sam Laub

The Mission Beyond Committee (MBC) is pleased to report the highlights of our work over the past year. As a church, we seek to "Transform Our World" by serving others in the name of Jesus Christ and to help carry out Jesus' commandment in Mark 16:15: "Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature."

This year MBC emphasized its approach to transform our world by adding and supporting a new mission partner, Casa Hogar Penniel in Mexicali. We are very thankful to John Leimbach for introducing us to this orphanage which provides a home for Mexican children.

Three of our MBC members, Mark Olcott, Ellen MacVean and Edward Lynds, were honored at the Interfaith Shelter Network Gala in October. PLCPC participated in the Interfaith Shelter Network in 2019, a PLCPC success that involved: (1) more than 8 guests housed each night for two weeks, (2) 115 guest-nights provided, (3) 171 dinners served, (4) 115 lunches provided, (5) 151 breakfasts provided, (6) 124 volunteer shifts worked, (7) 80 unique volunteers involved, and (8) over 650 volunteer hours worked. We want to thank the members of the Congregation involved for their support and work.

During the year invitees attending our meetings were: Pastor Karla who provided her wisdom and perspective on Mission (June), Sarah Butterfield who gave input on the Presbyterian National Mission Conference (October) and Raul Palomino of New Day Urban Ministries, formerly Presbyterian Urban Ministries or PUM (November), who gave an update on their ministry. Izdihar Kassis, leader of MBC's Lebanese mission partner, Together for the Family, and her husband, Riad Kassis, came to our church to tell us about their work helping

Steve Smith (chair), Cara Thome, and Pastor Karla and Jolene traumatized children and impoverished women who are in Wade served as *ex officio* members. Mary Harker and Ray refugee camps due to Middle East fighting.

Seven percent of the 10% we give to mission as a church is given in the forms of grants through the MBC. MBC administers these funds by developing relationships with mission partners (local, regional & global) and distributing financial support. Perhaps more important than the finance-related portion of the committee's role, we provide and/or promote opportunities for PLCPC members to roll up their sleeves and actively serve our community in the name of our Lord. MBC provided the umbrella support for SERVE projects including trips to Rancho Genesis, Ladle Fellowship, and work events such as I Love a Clean San Diego. "Wood to Wonderful" in Texas provided wooden toys to Barbara Brown that were bagged and donated to children at Rancho Genesis who were thrilled to receive them.

Additional highlights of 2019 include: distributed \$69,000 in support to 17 mission partners (approximately 59% local and regional, 41% global); continued a pilot project with Uplift to assist families transitioning from homelessness to housing; continued sponsoring a new village, Caña, in the Dominican Republic as part of the global effort to end rural poverty by Plant with Purpose (PWP).

Adult Ministry Beth Zedaker

In 2019, much was accomplished and offered in Adult Ministries. Both Men's and Women's Ministries facilitated many small Bible study and covenant groups, retreats, contemplative days, breakfasts, luncheons, and dinners with inspirational speakers.

Approximately 175 attended the Ash Wednesday dinner in the Family Life Center on March 6. We followed with a 5week Lenten series on Christ's final words.

The annual Women's retreat brought 100 women together to hear from Dr. Mindy Coates-Smith on the topic of Living Authentically.

The Women's Ministries offered a Bible study for young moms, a weekly Tuesday morning Bible study and the annual Women Connecting Dinner in the spring. Additional groups, opportunities and much more are offered during the week and they included: Sunday morning study, Men at Work, Community Bible Study, Mothers of Preschoolers-MOPS, Prayer Quilt Ministries, Red Brick Knitters, Rachel's Circle, ROOTED, Refresh, Continuing the Conversation, Centering Prayer and a summer book club.

Adult Ministries hosted a Block Party in the early summer, Deeper Dive series and Rooted small group series. Family Ministries enjoyed Family Camp in October. Spiritual Formation offered a Contemplative Day in the spring, as well as an art experience in the fall.
